Superintendent Apple reviewed Ameritas' terms for refinancing of the 2011 bonds.

Superintendent Apple presented the board with the final Aquestt rankings for the district, the junior/senior high, and the elementary.

President Matson reported to the board on the ongoing teachers' negotiations for the 2016-2017 school year.

Moved by Rippen; seconded by Marks to move into executive session at 7:59 PM to discuss administrative contracts. Aye votes Baker, Kolbet, Rippen, Marks, Scott, and Matson; nay votes none.

Moved by Baker; seconded by Rippen to move out of executive session at 8:59 PM. Aye votes Kolbet, Rippen, Marks, Scott, Matson, and Baker; nay votes none.

Moved by Baker; seconded by Kolbet to offer Superintendent Apple a 2% raise in salary and a one year roll over on his contract for the 2017-2018 school year. Aye votes Kolbet, Marks, Scott, Matson, and Baker; nay votes Rippen. Motion passes 5 to 1.

Moved by Rippen; seconded by Scott to offer Principal Kershaw a 5.5% increase in salary. Aye votes Marks, Scott, Matson, Rippen, Baker, and Kolbet; nay votes none.

President Matson appointed Scott, Rippen and Baker to a committee to address a new superintendent evaluation form.

Board member Rippen gave a report to the board on the NASB conference he attended in November.

Superintendent Apple's report as follows: (1) Superintendent Apple and Peggy Fyn will be attending an Affordable Health Care workshop in McCook on December 16th. (2) There has been one application for a Vo-Ag teaching position. (3) Krutsinger Construction has completed the concrete work at the secondary site. (4) A report on the NASB conference attended in November.
